Working together with city residents, Council, and administration, the Police, Code Enforcement, and Animal Control Departments preserve the quality of life that we have come to know and expect in Washougal.

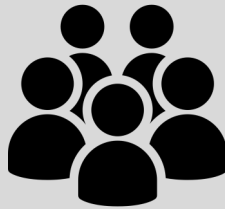

Drug Take Back Program

Drug Take Back Program In 2017 the Washougal Police Department became a member agency for the Drug Take Back Program. Subsequently, we have taken in hundreds of pounds of medicines that otherwise would have gone to the dump or been flushed down the drain, both of which impact ground water, the ecosystem, and wildlife.

Conversion to Digital Fingerprint Readers The new readers allow instant returns on fingerprints. Before the conversion to digital readers it could take up to four weeks to receive the results from the state. In the rolled system it was also not uncommon to have prints rejected because of a smudge, or other imperfection. If a print was rejected the department would have to repeat the entire process. The new system saves time, money, and is more accurate.

Animal Control

The Animal Control Division serves both the City of Washougal and the City of Camas. They work each and every day to address issues of neglect, abuse, loose and vicious dogs, barking dog complaints, dog bites, and lost and found dogs. Federal and state laws do not allow animal control officers to address problems, handle, relocate or otherwise interfere with animals other than dogs.

The City partners with the West Columbia Gorge Humane Society for help in addressing the City's animal needs. The Humane Society is also your local resource for cat related needs. More information can be found [HERE](#).

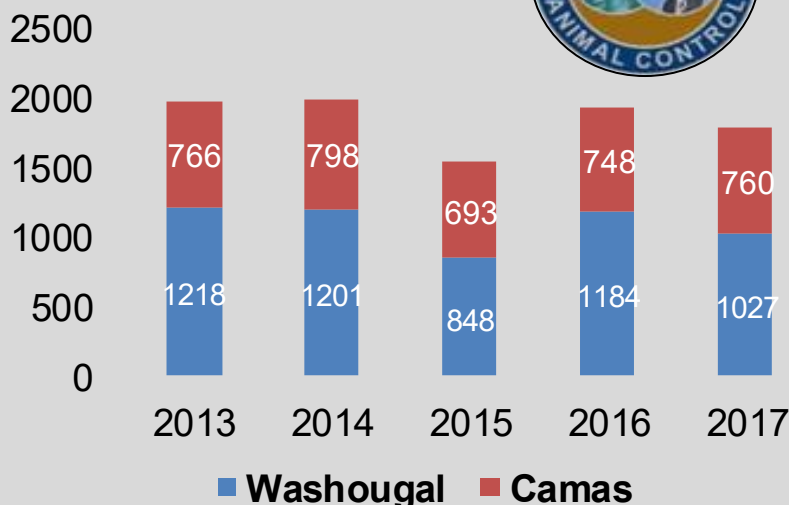

Code Enforcement

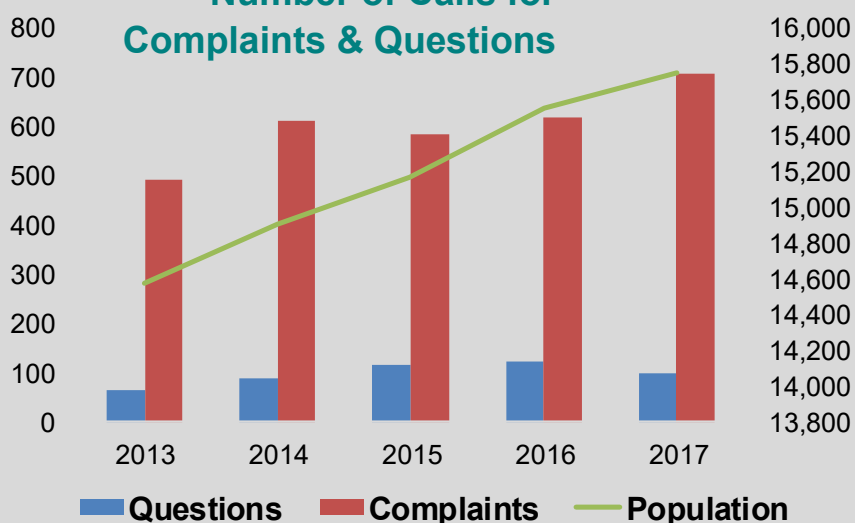

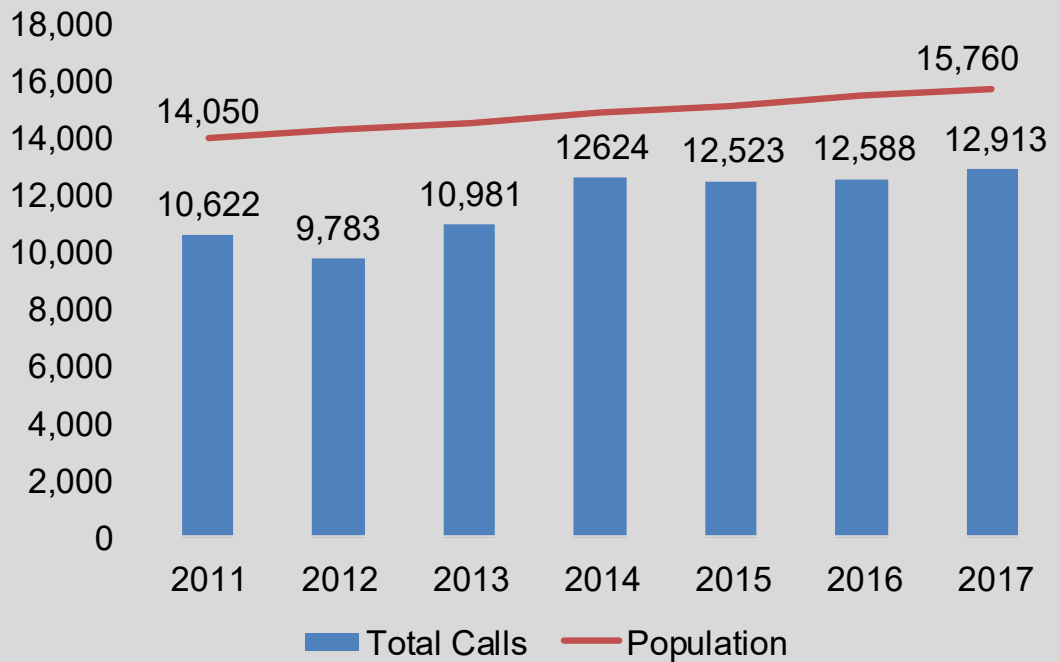
Number of Calls for Complaints & Questions

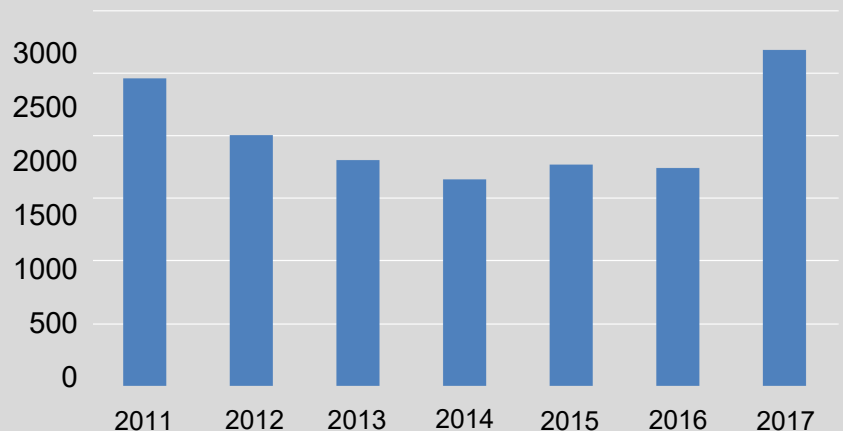
In response to vocalized complaints by many citizens, in 2017 the department prioritized traffic enforcement when department resources were available. This prioritization lead to an increase of 940 more traffic stops in 2017 than in 2016. The department is continuing its efforts into 2018 by emphasizing and raising awareness about driving under the influence.
